The OUV explains why a place is significant enough to be recognized as a World Heritage site and describes the values that make a place outstanding on an international scale. to help assemble a group of heritage professionals and locals with knowledge of the Tr'ondëk-Klondike region, in areas such as local community or traditional knowledge, cultural history, and mining history. This group will meet Sept. 20-22 in Dawson, and there will be a public information session on the afternoon of Sept. 21.

We're also planning a visit to Forty Mile on Friday Sept. 6 for TH citizens, so please join us for a campfire, snacks and a look around this interesting heritage site which Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in co-manages with Yukon Government. Come out and enjoy the fall colours!
